

ECCJ Implemented the Post Workshop Meeting of FY2016 Energy Conservation Support Projects for ASEAN

[Project Summary]

Under the instruction and financial support of the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI), for EE&C capacity building program, the Energy Conservation Center, Japan (ECCJ) presented the details and results of this fiscal year's AJEEP (ASEAN-JAPAN Energy Efficiency Partnership) projects at the post workshop meeting in Bangkok, Thailand for 2 days on March 7 and 8, 2017 to discuss the details and results of this fiscal year's projects with ASEAN member countries.

- (1) New Scheme 2 implemented the first year of the qualified energy manager trainer development program and qualified 8 persons from 4 countries (Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and Vietnam) as trainers.
- (2) Scheme 3 continued to provide support for Cambodia and Lao PDR, including S&L.

At the meeting (Bangkok, Thailand), we confirmed the details and results of FY2016 projects and exchanged opinions on a specific activity plan for the FY2017. The meeting was joined by the representatives (Focal Point or its proxy) of the ASEAN Energy Efficiency and Conservation Sub-sector Network (EE&C-SSN) from ASEAN member states and the ACE to summarize this fiscal year's results of the project.

- (1) Scheme 2 implemented the first year of the qualified energy manager trainer development program and qualified 8 persons from 4 countries (Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and Vietnam) as trainers. It is welcomed to use the Training Center in Thailand utilized for practical training the next fiscal year again and there was a request to include up-to-date topics in the textbook.
- (2) Scheme 3 dispatched experts to Cambodia and Lao PDR on two occasions in order to promote the project and bear its fruits. In Cambodia, a technical working group was launched for considering development of the qualified manager system and energy conservation guidelines for buildings. In Lao PDR, a specific action plan has been formulated. ECCJ will continue to conduct support for Lao PDR in the next fiscal year based on this Action Plan.
