ECCJ's Deputy Director of Training and Education Department, Mr.Kazuhiko Yoshida was awarded for the Contributions to Energy Conservation In the 33rd Ministers on Energy Meeting of the ASEAN held in Malaysia on 7th Oct. 2015.

In the 33rd Ministers on Energy Meeting of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia on October 7, 2015, Mr. Kazuhiko Yoshida (Deputy Director, International Capacity Building Center for Energy Conservation) of the Energy Conservation Center, Japan (ECCJ) was awarded for his contributions to the promotion of energy conservation activities through energy management in the ASEAN region.

The award is as a result of highly appreciated achievement in the ASEAN-Japan cooperation program in the energy conservation field, which was established in the 2000 between the Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry (METI) and ASEAN and has been implemented by ECCJ for 15 years since the same year.

Mr. Yoshida has been leading the cooperation program since 2002, when he joined ECCJ from a steel company.
