1.Name of measure

Energy Performance Contracting (EPC) Concept & Financing Scheme

2. Purpose of measure

To overcome the capital costs/financing barriers in implementing cost-effective energy efficiency measures. It will provides customers with a comprehensive set of energy efficiency, renewable energy and distributed generation measures and often is accompanied with guarantees that the savings produced by a project will be sufficient to finance the full cost of the project.

3. Outline and applicable sectors (transport, buildings, manufacturing, etc.)

The concept of EPC is based on a profit—sharing agreement between the building owner and the Energy Service Company (ESCO) whereby the initial capital cost for the energy efficiency improvement projects is fully—borne by the ESCO. In ensuring successful implementation of the EPC particularly in government sector, ESCOs are required to register with Energy Commission prior to register with Ministry of Finance to carry out EPC projects under the Green Technology Services Code (222801)

4. Financial resources and budget allocation of measures

ESCO will offer to implement and finance the project. Payment to ESCO is based upon the guaranteed savings achieve. The actual amount to be paid will be based upon the agreed sharing value between the ESCO and the owner.

- 1. Savings in terms of investment in identifying and implementing energy savings measures in government buildings.
