1. Name of measure

Energy Efficiency Standards and Labeling Program
(Started in 2005 and will end in 2014)

2. Purpose of measure

The energy efficiency standards and labeling program aims to improve the efficiency/performance of appliances, equipment and other energy consuming devices. Presently there are four sub-programs, namely: Efficiency Standard and Labeling for Room Air-conditioners; Energy labeling Program for Refrigerators and Freezers; Fluorescent Lamp Ballast Energy Efficiency Standard; and Energy Efficiency Standard and Labeling for Compact Fluorescent Lamp

3. Target sector (transport, building, manufacturing, etc.)

4. Funds and budget for the measure
