1.Name of measure

The Energy Conservation Promotion Act 1992 and its revised Act 2007

2.Purpose of measure

Buildings and factories

Any buildings and factories with an electricity meter of over 1000 kW, a transformer of over 1175 kVA, or consume over 20 million MJ/year are classified as designated buildings/factories. These designated buildings/factories have the responsibilities to appoint one or two, depending on the designated building/factory type, Person Responsible for Energy (PRE) and submit energy management report to the Ministry of Energy every year.

3.Outline and applicable sectors (transport, buildings, manufacturing, etc.)

4.Financial resources and budget allocation of measures

Ministry of Energy is responsible for training of PREs. However, buildings and factories themselves are responsible for cost incurred by PREs and energy management system

5.Method to measure effects of measures (reduction in energy consumption and energy cost, etc.) The amount of report submitted, resulting energy saving according to the reports

6.Results of measures

Approximately 85% of designated buildings/factories conduct energy management, resulting in an energy saving of 300 ktoe/year on average

7.Future tasks

Energy-efficiency technology demonstration, additional training of PREs, Appoint energy management report auditor to increase the quality of energy management report.
